



When I was a kid, Easter was a big deal at my house. Usually there were new clothes. Some years, the morning began with a community Sunrise Service that happened *at sunrise*, so we started very early. Those services were planned to be held outdoors, but I remember them also in the National Guard Armory building. I think there was also Easter breakfast at those services. Then we had our regular church service. Of course, we also had a very special Easter dinner at home. But the things I liked best in those days were the Easter baskets my sister and I got every year. They had chocolate. Chocolate eggs, chocolate bunnies, and, of course, jelly beans.

Those are some things I remember about childhood Easter, but there is so much more. Easter is about the resurrection of Jesus Christ after His crucifixion. The greatest gift is not new clothes or chocolate rabbits. The greatest gift is Jesus conquering sin and death. So for Easter this year, I have something special for you. It's a book. This is a special book that has a special mission. It's called *The Life and Teachings of Jesus of Nazareth*. It has been produced with the intention to be given away, shared with as many people as possible. *The Life and Teachings of Jesus of Nazareth* is a "gospel harmony" – a compilation of the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John presented in chronological order. It was written in an easy-to-read translation developed in partnership with Bible League International. It presents a readable and accessible account of the four gospels.

The books come from plusnothing.com. They have set a goal to give away 50 million copies of *The Life and Teachings of Jesus of Nazareth*. This is a project with an eternal impact, getting the gospel teachings of Jesus spread around the world. The plain language is a perfect fit for anyone to understand the teachings of

Jesus. Since 2020, 6.85 million copies have been shipped to all 50 states and 37 countries.

It was offered to the church to give away to guests at Easter. I thought that sounded like a great idea, but I

didn't want to just give one to guests. I want everyone to have one, and I want everyone to give one away. Think about the people you know who might be intimidated by a full-size Bible, knowing where to begin or just overwhelmed by the size of it. Think about people you have always wanted to

share more about your faith. Think about the ones you don't know well enough to get into faith discussions, but would be easy to hand a little book. There are plenty of free technological ways of sharing the Gospel, but there is something about giving a physical book to someone.



I hope you enjoy the challenge of unashamedly sharing the Gospel of Jesus with your friends, coworkers, waiters, postmen, trash collectors, and whoever you feel led

to give it to.

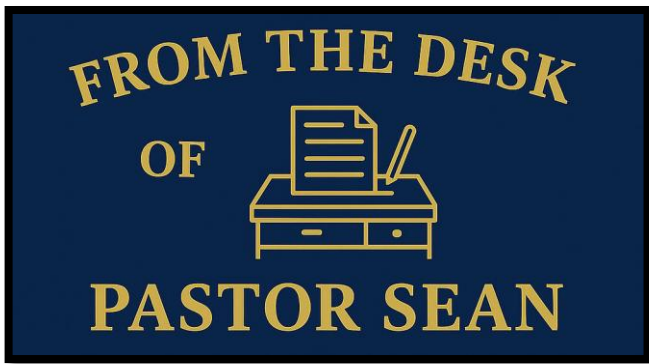

Every spring, our church prepares for something that has become a defining part of the mission for Shiloh Christian Church: stepping beyond our walls to serve others in the name of Jesus. This year, 26 people representing Shiloh will travel to Big Creek Mission in Kentucky from May 31st–June 6th, joining hands with a community we’ve grown to love and support.

Mission work is very important and has a way of shaping us. It stretches our faith, opens our eyes, and reminds us that the Gospel is lived out not only in what we say, but in how we show up for other people. For some on our team, this trip will be familiar. For others, it will be their first time stepping into a place where the needs are real and the opportunities to serve are everywhere. But for all of us, it’s a chance to be a part of something much bigger than ourselves.

Mission trips matter because they move us beyond what is comfortable. They place us in spaces where our routines don’t protect us and our assumptions don’t hold up. In those moments, God often speaks with a clarity we miss in the noise of our regular routine. We begin to see people the way Jesus sees them not as projects, but as neighbors, image-bearers, and partners in the work of the Kingdom.

It’s one thing to talk about serving others; it’s another to sit with someone, hear their story, and realize how deeply God loves them. Trips like this stretch our understanding of what it means to love our neighbor, and they remind us that the Gospel is always meant to move outward.

These trips matter because they shape our students. For a few of them, this is the first time they’ll see faith lived out in a context different from their own community. They’ll discover gifts they didn’t know they had. They’ll learn what it means to work hard, to listen well, and to serve without being noticed. These are the moments that form lifelong disciples. And Mission trips matter because the mission is something the whole church participates in not just the people who go on the trip. When we pray, when we encourage, and yes, when we give, we become part of the story God is writing through this team.

As we move toward the trip, our church family has the opportunity to come alongside the team in a very tangible way. A huge THANK YOU to everyone who helped with and donated to the lasagna fundraiser dinner on March 4th! Because of your generosity and support, we have raised \$4,581 so far for this trip! Washing Feet...A Letter from Lucy

A few years ago (probably more like fourteen years ago!), I worked as an aide part of the day in a kindergarten classroom. I helped gather and grade paperwork, read to the students, helped them get from point A to point B, took kids to recess, and helped with lots of other things young students do! One of my favorite things to do was help with art projects. Scissors are a challenge for some students, and cutting things out worked on fine motor skills. Gluing things together helped to work on control, of course, in the amount that is used. Coloring with crayons helped students learn boundaries (stay in the lines!). But painting was a whole different ball game! Students could go a little crazy with paint. Be creative. Mix colors. Try different strokes with the different size and shape brushes. Or using fingers, hands, or, my favorite, feet!

One of the projects I remember best (although I don't remember what they were making) involved painting 30 pairs of feet to create a craft to take home. But even though I don't remember what they were making, the memory still resonates with me today for what I learned in the process. You see, when you paint 30 pairs of feet, you also have to wash 30 pairs of feet!

I had a pan of warm water, a washcloth, and some towels. I had to kneel in front of each kindergartner. I was face to face with them at this level. I got to see if their feet were ticklish. If the water felt too cold or hot to them. I got to hear them giggle as I washed their feet. And I was humbled by the very act of washing each little foot.

I wondered how Jesus felt as he knelt to wash each disciple's feet. Especially since he knew what would

happen later that night. Those disciples would all run off and desert him. And one would betray him. And yet, what did he do? He still washed feet. It didn't matter whether they truly knew who he was or not. It didn't matter if there was betrayal in their hearts. It didn't matter what they would do to him. His purpose was to serve, and to give us an example in the washing of feet.

So what did I do? I washed feet. Dirty, stinky, sweaty feet! And it felt amazing to do it. To serve those kindergartners. To see the water take on the dirt and paint, and their feet to be clean and fresh and new. Just like Jesus took on our dirt and sweat and stink as well, leaving us fresh and clean and new.

So now, every year as Maundy Thursday approaches, I think about those kindergartners. I wonder where they are and what their lives are like. Those students probably

don't even remember that day when I washed their feet. But it will always remind me of Jesus. And because of that, I always try to wash someone's feet (usually my husband's feet!) to remind me to take the time to serve people like Jesus did.

So now it's our turn. Easter is fast approaching. Go and serve someone like Jesus did. And if you need to really see the depths of his service, grab a large bowl of warm water, a washcloth, and towel, and find someone who will let you wash their feet!

"After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him....Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you."--John 13: 5, 14-15

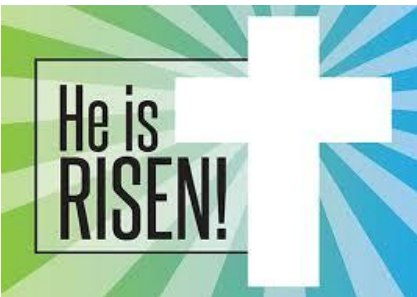

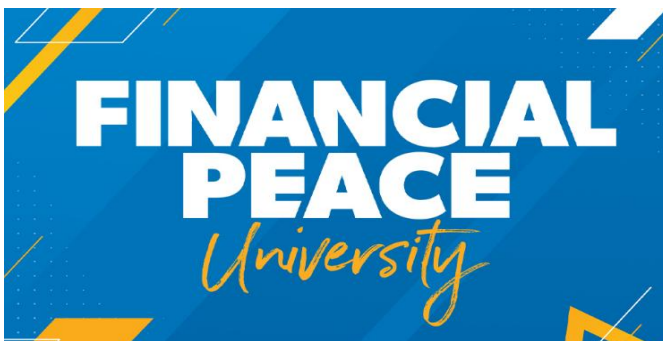

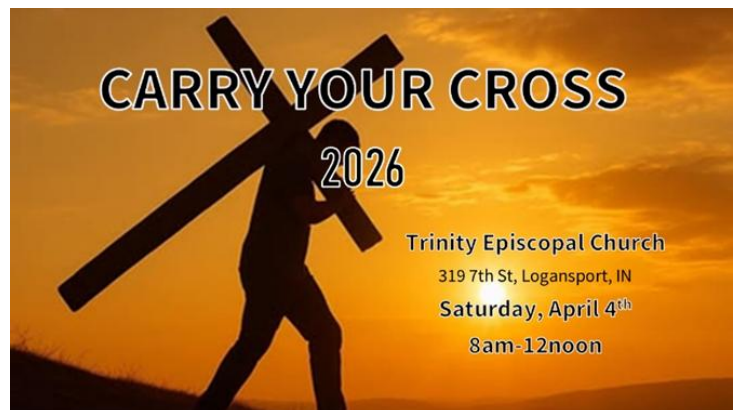
