A Moment

With Mark



I'm *really* glad to be here! Some of you heard me say that on Sunday May 19th which followed a 2000+ mile road trip. It seemed like a good idea when I suggested it. In trying to help Bo and Joanna work out the logistics

of moving to Indiana from Page, Arizona and considering the options for traveling that far with 20-month-old Eliza, I said I would be willing to fly to Arizona and drive one of their cars. That way Joanna and Eliza could fly to Indiana.

As I researched the airline schedule, I remembered there is a flight from Mesa, AZ to South Bend, IN which flies back to Mesa the same day. So the first step of the journey was for Joanna and Eliza to

drive 291 miles from Page to Mesa. They would park at the airport parking lot and fly to South Bend, arriving at 10:02 p.m. When they got off the plane, I would meet them at the gate because I would be ready to get on the plane they came in on. I got Joanna's car keys and told her where to go to meet Lucy and Ruby, who would bring them home to Royal Center. Then I flew to Mesa and got her car from airport parking. Joanna had video called me and sent me a picture of where the car was parked. I was able to get off the parking shuttle and walk to the car as if I had parked it there myself!

Then I had 291 miles to drive to Page after spending the night near Mesa. In Page, Bo and I finished packing the cars and got checked out of their rental house on Tuesday. After spending the night with one of Bo's friends, we hit the road Wednesday morning. It's a long haul from Page, AZ to Amarillo, TX, but I planned that on purpose to get the long day in first. It seemed to get

dark early, and the wind blew hard as we drove into an evening storm. It was dark and raining when we got to our Airbnb for the night, and we were exhausted.



We had been across two timelines so it was after 9 p.m. when we arrived.

It was cloudy Thursday morning, but Bo and I were

grateful it wasn't raining. We followed each other across Oklahoma on the turnpike. Neither one of us were used to toll roads, but we figured it out and kept moving. After a pepperoni pizza at Post Game Pizza in Marshfield, MO we headed up the road to find our beds. It was early enough to walk around the place and pet the horses. I told the owners I might have to come back when we can spend some time hiking in their woods. I think Bo and I both slept better that night.

At the advice of the Airbnb hosts, we went up the road about a half an hour to a café for breakfast on Friday. When we went in, somebody told us to sit anywhere. Nobody came to get our order, and I wondered if we would get to eat. It turns out the regular waitress was on vacation and her sub didn't show up, but the food was good when we got it. Our next stop was lunch in St. Louis with Mom and Dad. They were glad to see us for a little bit, but we had to hit the road knowing we were going to lose another hour that day. It was about 9 p.m. when we finally rolled in at 5787 N County Rd 800 W, Royal Center, IN.

In the days leading up to this, I found myself repeating the plan to nearly everybody I knew. Many of you were praying that all the moving pieces would align and that we would be protected from mechanical breakdowns and dangerous weather. On Friday, as Bo and I were getting our last meal on the road, I saw a TV news broadcast which showed storm damage in Oklahoma. I told Bo we must have been just ahead of that nasty storm. Later, I thought about that a little more and saw more storms and tornados in Oklahoma. The more I think about all the things which could have gone wrong and how well our trip went, the more grateful I am for your prayers and for God's protection and guidance.



WOW! The sermon schedule for June is exciting! The people's choice best Sunday of the year is back with the mission trippers reporting on June 23rd.

Then we have a very special fifth Sunday. The band *Attaboy* will be here to share their music and their mission in the schools of the United States. You will want to invite your friends that Sunday for sure. And bring something to share for lunch.



God's Timing...A Letter from Lucy

God's timing is certainly not my timing. The day after Easter, Joanna lost her job in Page, Arizona. It

threw us all for a loop! We didn't know how we could help, or what they would do. Joanna immediately started looking for a new job. But this time, she decided to check closer to our home, along with applying for jobs near their home. The first response she got was for a position at a school in Lafayette, After interviewing with Indiana. them, she was offered the position, which includes teaching mentoring young people in how to

figure out their future endeavors after high school. She was excited about this new position and said "yes" to the new adventure.

This, of course, meant a move to Indiana. It meant that Bo would have to start again to get on the

transplant list here. It meant that they would have to leave behind most of their furniture and other stuff to get here. It meant that they would have to say goodbye to all the people who had helped them through the hard days as Bo's health deteriorated, and he began dialysis. It meant that little Eliza's routine was turned upside down as she moved into a time zone 3 hours ahead of her own!

And it meant a big change for us as well. For now, they are living with us. It is chaotic and a little crazy in our house right now. And I am thrilled to have them closer! But the timing is certainly not what I would have chosen for this journey. But God's timing is not my timing.

Some of you may not know the next part. Although God has chosen this time to bring our daughter back home, He has also chosen this time for our son to be deployed. In a very short time, we will once again have a child far away (and I thought Arizona was too far!). Right now it is hard for this mama to

feel like God's timing is right! I know He wants what is best for us, and what will bring Him the glory, but my heart is hurting right now. Some days, I feel like I am barely keeping my head above water.

But I have experienced His timing before. The time I was 8 months pregnant, and Mark took a job in Indiana, and God had our house sell the day after we put it on the market. The time He sent our family to Mexico to serve the people there. The time in

Mexico, when He kept Aaron from being badly hurt when he fell off a ladder. The time He sent Joanna to Papua, New Guinea, and her perspective about life and people changed forever. The time He sent Mark to the Great Banquet so he could listen to

God's leading about being a pastor. The times He has kept us safe when we didn't even know there was danger. God's timing.

While I was writing this article, the tears have flowed. Tears of sadness for Aaron leaving, and tears of joy for Eliza being closer. But also as I have thought back to all the times that God's timing has been right, it has brought a clarity that I can still trust Him. I can trust that He is in control. I can trust that He will work all things out

for His good. And I can trust that His timing is right.

Please pray for my kids as they follow His leading in their own lives, here and across the world, in His time. For I know that "He makes all things beautiful in His time."

"Trust in the Lord with all of your heart, and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways, acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight."--Proverbs 3:5-6




