

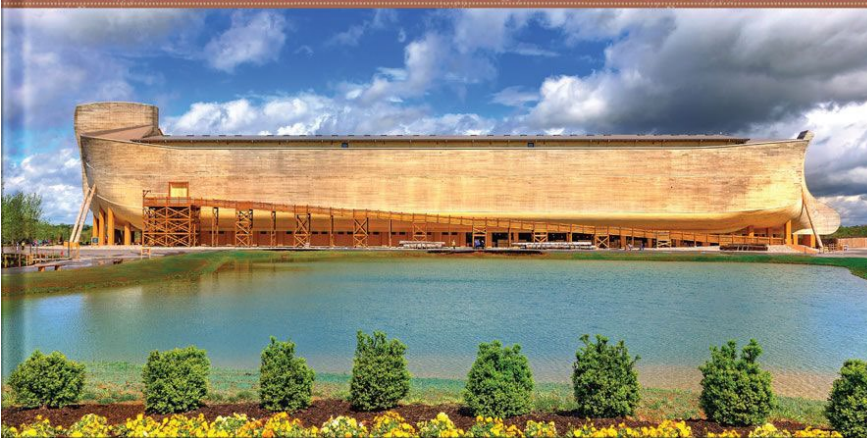

COME AND SEE

If I had a nickel for every time Eliza said, “Come and see,” I would be a millionaire. Throughout the day, she is constantly coming to get me, and tugging on my hand, urging me to drop whatever I am doing, to “come and see.” There is always something thrilling to her that she needs to share with me. And her excitement makes me want to follow her to see what new thing she has discovered!

If I am honest, I do the same with her. Especially when we are outside in the Spring. New plants are making their way up through the dirt. Flowers are blooming. Strawberries are ripening. Asparagus is growing. The trees are beginning to bud. The rhubarb is getting ready to be cut. The dandelions are showing their beautiful yellow heads, and the bees are enjoying their sweet nectar. And Eliza is thrilled to follow me to see each new thing.

When we are stuck inside, there are still new things for her to explore and learn about. I have invited her into the kitchen to “come and see” what we can make with ingredients. I have put on her apron and handed her paint so she can “come and see” what masterpieces she can create. She has “come and seen” how to put the laundry in the washer and dryer, and how wonderful they smell and how soft her blanket is when it comes out of the dryer.

I hope that I have also invited her to “come and see” what God has done in my life. When she tastes a ripe strawberry or chews an asparagus spear, that I also share with her about God’s magnificent creation of this world and our part in it. I hope that I have invited her to “come and see” when we have mixed cookie dough and pie crust and cupcakes that God can take everything that happens to us and make something good out of it. I hope that the stories we read from her Bible teach her to “come and see” Jesus as her Savior and Lord. I want her to “come and see” the empty tomb and know that there is hope for us all because He lives! And I pray that all of us can tell others to “come and see” what Jesus has done in our lives. May we have the same excitement that Eliza has when she asks me to “come and see.” What could be more urgent or exciting than a relationship with Jesus? For someone who doesn’t know that they can be a child of the King, we can invite them to “come and see!” And God allows us to share in that kingdom work! And it’s so simple to say, “Come and see!”

“The angel said to the women, ‘Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He has risen, just as He said. **COME AND SEE** the place where He lay.’” Matthew 28:5-6

“The woman left her water jar beside the well and ran back to the village, telling everyone, ‘**COME AND SEE** a man who told me everything I ever did! Could he possibly be the Messiah?’ So the people came streaming from the village to see Him.” John 4:28-30

A few weeks ago on a Friday evening, I got a phone call from my friend Adam Morrow. It's not unusual to get a call from Adam, he is the liaison on the Cass Co. Sheriff's department for the volunteer chaplain team, which I am part of. But this time when he called, he was calling for official business. One of the church neighbors had called 911 because of mischief in the church parking lot. There had been a truck doing donuts and drifting in the gravel. When Adam called, he was at the church and could see the gravel that had been thrown around. I told him we have security cameras so there might be video of the culprit. The next morning, I saved a video clip to give Adam. The truck looked like a lot of other trucks, and I did not expect anything to come of it.

But a week later, on Saturday morning there were fresh tracks and more damage to the lot. This time Grace Carlson heard it happening and called it in. It happened about midnight and the nighttime video was only good enough to see that it was probably the same truck as last week. I shared the first video in our Facebook group and that resulted in discovering

the truck stuck in a field. The truck was towed and impounded, but it was a few days before anyone came looking for it. I got a call from Adam the following Wednesday saying that a young man named Jesus Melicio had come in to get his truck and had admitted to doing the damage to our parking lot. Adam told me he seemed to be genuinely remorseful and asked me what Shiloh wanted to do.

The following Monday was a regular board meeting, so I asked if he would come to the meeting and talk to us. Adam Morrow offered to come to the meeting also. Jesus arrived early and was visibly nervous as we went to the meeting room. He sat very quietly in the meeting room as most of the board arrived. Tim Morris opened the meeting with prayer and the first order of business was to have Jesus tell us about himself and what happened in our parking lot.

He is 18 years old and was trying to have some fun. He came to the meeting because he wanted to say that he is sorry and wants to make it right. We asked him some questions about school and work and where he goes to church. We talked about the cost of repairing the damage. The attitude of the board members was gentle and caring. We acknowledged that we all have done some stupid things, especially in our teen years.

Then we talked about our local mission project, SAWs, which builds accessibility ramps for people who need them. We suggested that we would like him to spend some time with us building a ramp as a service to the community. By this time, Jesus was much more relaxed, and he agreed that it would be good to help build a ramp. Before Jesus left, Pastor Sean presented him with a Bible, Ed Waters told him we are more concerned about his salvation than about the gravel in the parking lot, and we prayed for him.

We may or may not ever know about the impact of that evening on Jesus. But from my seat I saw grace in action and an opportunity taken to make a positive difference in a young man's life. As we continue this journey through life, may we all strive to give the grace we have been given.

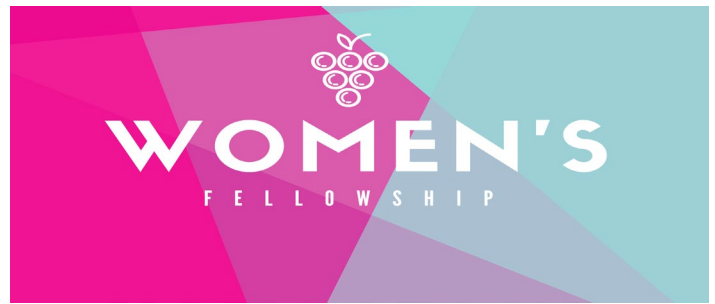
